

Sports and PE Premium statement 2016-17

The Government has acknowledged the importance of sport and physical exercise in the lives of young people. To support improvements in such activities in school, they have continued to allocate a sport premium. During the academic year 2016/17, Stanley Primary School has been allocated a total of £10,630.

At Stanley, the Governors agree that the money must be used so that all children benefit regardless of their sporting ability.

The funding is used to contribute to professional sports delivery by a specialist teacher and a sports apprentice. The sports apprentice supports staff to deliver their PE lessons, therefore providing on-site professional development. This has an impact on P.E. and sport throughout the school as staff are more confident in their delivery and better supported in their preparation for lessons. Children have the opportunity to try a wide variety of different sports during their time at Stanley, which has a positive influence on the concentration and attitude of all children. Some of the funding is also used to provide training for other members of staff to deliver better sport provision.

The impact of improved sport provision can be seen in the wide variety of clubs and competitions which our children take part in and the success they enjoy in these. An element of the sports premium has been used to facilitate our entry into sporting competitions. We have continued to have successes in various schools' sports competitions.
