IMPORTANT - SOCIAL MEDIA SUPPORT

It is really important that we bring to your attention an issue that has been causing concern among the school community. As parents, it is crucial for you to stay informed about the challenges our children face in the digital age. We regularly see popular social media platforms, such as TikTok and WhatsApp having a negative impact on our children's well-being in Stanley. These platforms, despite their entertainment value, have been found to expose our children to inappropriate content and interactions that are not age-appropriate. As a result, we have observed that these problems are spilling into the school environment, causing upset and distress among our children. These issues often stem from children gaming online with eachother with no adult supervision.

Please can we request your cooperation in addressing this issue as a collective effort between parents and the school. It is essential that we educate our children about the responsible use of social media/online usage and the potential risks they may encounter. Additionally, I encourage you to monitor your child's online activities and ensure they are engaging in age-appropriate content as staff are obviously not able to do that for you and it regularly interrupts teaching and learning when issues come into school that have started over social media/gaming. By working together, we can create a safer and more positive digital environment for our children. I sincerely hope you will join us in addressing this matter promptly.

ADULT.


A MESSAGE FROM YEAR 2
