HARVEST FESTIVAL

Each year at Harvest time, Stanley school likes to show our support to local charities by asking our pupils to provide small donations of food or toiletries. As well as helping others in need, this teaches the children how to be a kind and charitable member of the community. These donations can be brought into school with the, children or dropped off in the foyer of the office anytime up until Wednesday 12th October 2022.

On this date, Class 2X will be hosting an assembly for the school in support of this festival. This year, our donations will be sent to the Blackpool charity **Streetlife**.

Food donations we receive go towards food parcels made for young people. Before giving to us, please ensure that anything donated is non-perishable, and still 'in date'. Items include:

- Juice
- Coffee
- Water
- Tinned Meat
- Tinned Fish

Similarly to food parcels, we also accept donations of bathroom items to make toiletry parcels. Please be aware we cannot make use of products that have been previously opened. Items include:

- Shampoo
- Conditioner
- Deodorant
- Razor
- Shaving foam

Operation Encompass now operates throughout Lancashire police force. It helps police and schools work together to provide emotional and practical help to children. The system ensures that when police are called to an incident of domestic abuse, where there are children in the household who have experienced the domestic incident, the police will inform the school (Miss Manson) before the child or children arrive the following day. This ensures that the school has up to date relevant information about the child's circumstances and can enable support to be given to the child.
