## Homework

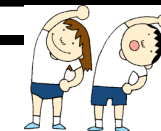
Children are expected to read aloud **daily** at home, this should be **signed by an adult** in their reading diaries. If children choose to read a newspaper or other text, this can be written in too.

Spellings will be given weekly on a Monday for a test on Friday. It is really important that these spellings are practised so that children learn the rule and can embed this in their writing. Times tables will also be tested weekly and we really encourage the children to use TT Rockstars to practise at home too, ready for the official Multiplication Tables Check next June.

One piece of homework will be given weekly - on a Wednesday, due in the following Monday. This might be English, Maths, Science or relating to other subjects. Sometimes project based homework is given. It may be a spoken or practical task.

Pencil cases should not be in school. Equipment is provided. Please ensure your child has a bottle with water only, for use in the classroom.

## P.E



Children should come to school in their PE Kits on a Tuesday and a Friday (for this half term only!). We will be beginning sessions with the staff from Blackpool BFCCT, as part of the Fit2Go program, towards the end of September.
